lives of residents by re-engaging them with family, friends, and healthcare providers, all while generating revenue for your practice. Mobile hearing services provide basic ear health, hearing aid care, and hearing aid management to facilities. This solution will change the way hearing care is provided, creating a more efficient, cost-effective service for residents that brings them back into the conversation.
